Part 1: BIDDING PROCEDURES

1.0 References

The definitions used in the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Act [Chapter22:23] ("the Act"), the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets (General) Regulations (Statutory Instrument No. 5 of 2018) ("the Regulations") and the General Conditions of Contract for the Procurement of goods apply to this Standard Bidding Document. The Act and the Regulations govern the submission of Bids and should be read by all Bidders.

1.1 Preparation of Bids

- 3. Bidder's Detail Form must be completed and submitted together with the bid;
- 4. All Bidders must complete all schedules without failure for them to be eligible bidders to attach a copy of every document necessary to demonstrate eligibility in terms of section 28 (1) of the Regulations;
- 5. Proof of Registration with the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe (PRAZ) in the relevant category; **GE001**
- 6. A bid security of **USD500.00** payable in Zimbabwean Dollars at the RBZ prevailing Interbank rate of the day in the format specified in this part;
- Proof of payment of USD350.00 payable in Zimbabwean Dollars at the RBZ prevailing Interbank rate of the day to the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe Special Procurement Oversight Committee fee;

- Bid Validity of Sixty (60) days must be clearly stated;

- 12. Delivery period is within six (6) to eight (8) weeks after receipt of order and must be clearly stated.

- 14. Minimum of three (3) trade reference letters from customers (Excluding ZETDC) with active contact details showing bidders' direct experience in the supply and delivery of Electrical Products.
- 15. Minimum of two (2) trade reference letters from customers (Excluding ZETDC) with active contact details showing manufacturers' direct experience in the supply and delivery of Contact Resistance Test Meter.
- 16. Manufacturers Supply History of at least 3 years to be provided with the Bid.
- 17. The contact resistance test meter must be tested and calibrated according to relevant IEC and IEEE standards and the calibration certificate must be included in the documentation.
- Technical Guarantee schedule to be completed in full, signed for and shall be compliant with ZETDC requirements
- Technical Brochures with detailed literature covering the tendered items to be included in the bid.

You are advised to carefully read the complete Bidding Document, as well as the Special Conditions of Contract in Part 3: Contract, which are available on the Authority's website, before preparing your Bid. Part 3: Contract is provided not for completion at this stage but to enable Bidders to note the Contract terms they will enter into if their Bid is successful. The standard forms in this document may be retyped for completion but the Bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction. All pages of the Bid must be clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number above, the Bidder's name, and any reference number.

1.2 Lots

There are no lots in this bidding document.

1.3 Number of bids allowed

No Bidder may submit more than one Bid, either individually or as a joint venture partner in another Bid, except as a subcontractor. Conflict of interest will be deemed to arise if Bids are received from more than one Bidder owned, directly or indirectly, by the same person.

 Bidders should note that only the main offers will be considered. No alternatives or options will be entertained unless on a separate bid.

1.4 Clarifications

Clarification of the bidding document may be requested from ZETDC Supply Chain Manager in writing on duly signed company letterhead by email to procurement@zetdc.co.zw at any time on or before 21 November 2023. If a prospective Tenderer sends an inquiry after the stated date or the inquiry is received by ZETDC after the stated date, ZETDC shall not respond to the inquiry but ignore it.

1.5 Responses to Clarifications

All responses to clarifications will be posted on ZETDC website www.zetdc.co.zw. Bidders should frequently check for updates on the website until the closing date of the tender.

1.6 Eligibility and qualification requirements

Bidders are required to meet the criteria in section 28 of the Act and section 28 (1) of the Regulations to be eligible to participate in public procurement and to be qualified for the proposed Contract. They must therefore;

- have the legal capacity to enter into a contract;
- not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or being wound up, not have had business activities suspended and not be the subject of legal proceedings for any of these circumstances;
- 3. have fulfilled their obligations to pay taxes and social security contributions in Zimbabwe;
- 4. not have a conflict of interest in relation to this procurement requirement;
- not be debarred from participation in public procurement under section 72 (6) of the Act and section 74(1) I, (d) or (e) of the Regulations or declared ineligible under section 99 of the Act;
- 6. have the nationality of an eligible country as specified in the Special Conditions of Contract; and
- 7. have been registered with the Authority as a Supplier and have paid the applicable Supplier Registration Fee set out in Part III of the Fifth Schedule to the Regulations.

1.8 Validity of Bids

1.10 Bid Opening

Bidders and their representatives may witness the opening of bids which will take place at the submission address immediately following the deadline.

1.11 Withdrawal, amendment or modification of Bids

A Bidder may withdraw, substitute, or modify its Bid after it has been submitted by sending a written notice, duly signed by an authorized representative. However, no Bid may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of Bids and the expiration of the period of Bid validity specified by the Bidder or any extension of that period.

1.12 Bid Prices and Discounts

1.14 Evaluation of Bids

Bids will be evaluated using the following methodology:

- Preliminary examination to confirm that all documents required have been provided, to confirm the eligibility of Bidders in terms of section 28(1) of the Regulation and to confirm that the Bid is administratively compliant in terms of section 28(2) of the Regulation.
- 2. Technical evaluation to determine their substantial responsiveness to the specifications in the Statement of Requirements;
- 3. Financial evaluation and comparison to determine the evaluated price of Bids and to determine the lowest evaluated Bid.

Bids failing any stage will be eliminated and not considered in subsequent stages.

1.15 Currency

Bids should be priced in United States Dollars.

1.16 Review by the Special Procurement Oversight Committee (SPOC)

Section 54 of the Act provides for review by the SPOC. This requirement will be subject to SPOC.

1.17 Award of Contract

The lowest evaluated bid after the application of any additional evaluation criteria, including any margin of preference, which is substantially responsive to the requirements of this Bidding Document will be recommended for award of the contract. The proposed award of contract will be by issue of a Notification of Contract Award in terms of section 55 of the Act, which will be effective until signature of the contract documents in accordance with Part 3: Contract. Unsuccessful Bidders will receive the Notification of Contract Award and, if they consider they have suffered prejudice from the process, they may, within 14 days of receiving this Notification, submit to the Procuring Entity a Challenge in terms of section 73 of the Act, subject to payment of the applicable fee set out in section 44 of and the Third Schedule to the Regulations.

1.18 Right to Reject

1.19 Corrupt Practices

The Government of Zimbabwe requires that Procuring Entities, as well as Bidders and Contractors, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of contracts. In pursuit of this policy:



2.3.2 SCOPE

The supply and delivery of Contact Resistance Test meter complete with test leads and clamps and any special tools and accessories.

2.3.3 PARTICULARS OF THE ELECTRICAL SYSTEM

Unless otherwise specified in the Schedule of Requirements, it must be assumed that the electrical system in which the contact resistance test meter will be used is a 400kV AC system:

HV Equipment, 400kV - Maximum operating voltage 420kV, 3-phase, 50Hz, effectively earthed neutral.

2.3.4 PARTICULARS OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Unless otherwise specifically stated in the Technical Schedules, any equipment, component and assembly shall be designed for the following service conditions:

2.3.5 PARTICULARS OF THE SPECIFICATION

a) Note that the contact resistance test equipment is for use on outdoor equipment in a harsh electrical environment and in subtropical environmental conditions.

b) The Equipment shall withstand electric fields and magnetic fields found in 400kV substations.

2.3.6 General

The Contact Resistance Test Meter must conform to the standards specified below: The design and workmanship shall be in accordance with the best engineering practice to ensure satisfactory performance and service life. The Supplier shall furnish the required instruction manuals and also the detailed maintenance manuals.

2.4 LANGUAGE, UNITS AND STANDARDS

All tenders, correspondence, description upon drawings, illustrations or instructions shall be in unambiguous English Language. SI units of measurements shall be used throughout. In the case of conflict between the any standards and this specification, the ruling of this specification shall prevail.

Design and Construction

2.4.1 Specific Requirement

The Contact Resistance Test meter shall be manufactured and supplied in accordance with the internationally accepted standards and also conform to the requirements of IEC standards.

2.4.2 MATERIAL

2.4.2.1 Quality of Material

The test meter and its accessories shall be new and of the best available quality and of the class most suitable for working under the conditions specified and shall withstand the variations of temperature and atmospheric conditions arising under working conditions without distortion or deterioration in the setting up of undue stresses in any parts and also without affecting the suitability of the various parts of the Works for which they were designed. No toxic material (such as Halon, PCB, and Asbestos) shall be utilized.

2.4.2.2 Electrical Equipment Material

All materials incorporated in the equipment supplied shall be new and of first-class commercial quality, free from defects and imperfections.

Surface Treatment and Painting.

The particulars of priming and finishing paintings shall be stated in the Tender, with specifications of paint, together with a listing of colours available, for the contact resistance test meter, its test leads and accessories.

2.4.2.3 Bolts, Studs, Nuts, Screws, Washers, etc.

 All bolts, studs, nuts, etc., shall have a standard metric threading and conform to the relevant standards as regards shape and tolerance. They shall be marked by the manufacturer's symbol and class of strength.

- All bolts, studs, nuts, washers, screws, etc., above 10mm diameter, if not in stainless steel or other corrosion-resistant material, shall be hot-dip galvanised, except for bolts above Strength Class 8.8. In this case, corrosion-resistant material will be preferred. Bolts, etc., smaller that 10mm diameter shall be electrolytic zinc-coated if not provided in stainless steel or other corrosion-resistant material.
- Bolts, nuts, studs and screws which require frequent tightening and unbolting during inspection or maintenance procedures shall be of stainless steel.
- All bolts and nuts shall be hexagonal, either normally or of the round head socket type and secured in an approved manner against becoming loose during operation.

2.4.3 IDENTIFICATION AND MARKING

2.4.4 General

All Contact resistance test meters shall be appropriately labelled with the name and model number and any other details which makes for easy identification.

2.4.5 Nameplates

Nameplates if any shall show the maker's name, model, serial number, year of manufacture, main characteristic data of the respective equipment and further relevant information specified in the applicable standards or necessary for the proper identification of the equipment involved. All main equipment shall have the nameplates in English. The Employer may direct special labelling or nameplates to be written in local language.

2.4.6 Labels and Plates

A corrosion-resistant nameplate with clearly legible writing shall be permanently attached to each piece of equipment at an easily visible place. It shall provide all necessary information pertaining to the equipment, but as a minimum, the following must be included: manufacturer's name, type of equipment, serial number, year of manufacture, project identification number, weight, EDS code and other relevant information in compliance with applicable standards. Any special maintenance instructions shall also be shown at this or other suitable location.


